## **OBJECTIVE**

## **SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA & ELIGIBILITY**

"The Sunday celebration of the Lord's Day and his Eucharist is at the heart of the Church's life. Sunday is the day on which the paschal mystery is celebrated in light of the apostolic tradition and is to be observed as the foremost holy day of obligation in the universal church. A parish is the place where all the faithful can be gathered for the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist. The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice...and participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to His Church." (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2177-2182)

Living as a Faithful Catholic Family includes 'Keeping holy the Lord's Day'.

To what frequency, and where, do you and your family attend Sunday Mass?

The Christian family is the first place of education in prayer. ... the family is the "domestic church" where God's children learn to pray "as the Church".
